

to Agency 42 which is the Beef Board, page 106. This is simply a reflection of the agency request level. It includes the continuation of basic services and no expansion of agency activities. If you'll notice, that is entirely a cash funded operation raised by the beef checkoff in Nebraska. And that generally reflects the amount of money that they will have to spend. The next one is the Nebraska Brand Committee, Agency 39, on page 107. This, again, is a basically continuation budget of basic services. The lower 1990-91 funding level is based upon the agency requests and reflects the agency's desire to provide services in a more efficient manner. That is basically a cash funded too, or is a cash funded. Agency 86, Dry Bean Commission on page 109, again, a cash funded agency funded by checkoff funds, basically a continuation budget, a request...excuse me, of \$300,000 for '89-90, \$320,000 authority for '90-91. It reflects full-time staffing of the commission which was established here in 1987. It does research and marketing contracts, an outreach to dry bean growers in Nebraska. Once again, it is a cash funded. This allows them to spend the amount of money that they anticipate will come in. The next one is Agency 32, page 52, Board of Educational Lands and Funds. Represents primarily a continuation budget for the operation of the State Surveyor's Office and a continuation of cash funds to settle disputed surveys in 1989 and 1990, 1991. It also includes a one-time appropriation of \$42,000 to purchase Geographic Information System software, that is GIS, and in 1990-91 an additional 4,000 for a related printer. This generally reflects a 3 percent increase in expenditures for the operation of school lands, Educational Lands and Funds. Agency 50, page 127, Nebraska State Colleges. You can see the total figures on that page, if you're following along. Down at the bottom you can see the additional continuation service budget that we provided, having to do with the instructional equipment, Social Work program, High Plains Grant Center, additional financial aid counselor was allowed. Additional...that all at Chadron. At Kearney, instructional equipment, an increase in instructional equipment being provided, an expansion in operating funds for the instructional departments. As you know, Kearney State is growing, has been growing very rapidly and was the most underfunded of the four state colleges and so it is reflected in additional budget here in this issue. There was additional instructional staff provided, additional support staff for instructional programs provided, funding in additional for the Business Development Center staff which is at Kearney, and all of the state colleges
