

Agricultural Promotion and Development Program as well as some other programs where we're replacing some declining federal funds. In the division of weights and measures we've increased the Cash Fund appropriation to upgrade some inspectors and increased the General Fund appropriation to hire an additional inspector to work in the North Central Nebraska area. A little change in the dairies and foods. Agricultural laboratories and some inspector salary upgrades with...done with basically Cash Funds. Moving on down to ag statistics, we have \$13,000 General Fund appropriation to begin data collection on the county level. Currently, this data collection is compiled at the district level. With this appropriation we'll do it on the county level. The next page of your book, page 105, State Board of Agriculture, simply continue the \$40,000 General Funds to provide...that are used to supplement 4-H and FHA premiums at the State Fair. Next agency, the Nebraska Corn Board found on page 108 of your book. It's simply increase...not increasing, it's a Cash Fund appropriation of \$1.88 million. This recommendation increases a 16 percent increase in '89-90 and an additional 4.6 percent increase in '90-91. Part of the increase this year is due just to the fact that there's some money there and they're buying down their surplus. Agency 16, the Department of Revenue, 49.8 General Fund appropriation this year, 50.5 next year, a total appropriation 52.5 this year and 53.1 next year, the mainline bill and basically we're using continuation programs all along, but we have combined program 105, the property tax program, and program 102 which...to allow flexibility in managing problems that arise between property tax program and the sales and income tax program. And that's really the basic change in there with the exception that the Governor's bill included approximately a million dollars in General Fund reappropriation but the appropriation bill did not. On Supreme Court, it's a sizeable \$25.5 million General Fund appropriation, \$25.6 million total appropriation. When you think of the Supreme Court you've got to remember that's all the court system across the state. Now the Supreme Court has eliminated the prehearing conference program which resulted in \$101,000 General Fund savings annually, but I want to point out that funding has been added to the tune of \$266,000 for both years to add nine probation officers and four and a half staff members to support those probation officers. Also, of course, because of passed law, judges salaries have increased by 5 percent in both years at a cost of \$399,000. Also I want to point...well, \$399,000 this year, \$804,000 next year.
