

in each year of the biennium, and the reason why it was not in the Governor's budget is she was assuming the passage of LB 311 introduced by Senator Landis dealing with the wastewater control program, and right now there is some questions about 311, and I am sure Senator Landis could talk to you about that, but what we did is not assume that passage, and rather put the \$2.2 million into the program as General Funds. The other area that is a departure a little bit is the low-level waste program. We have authorized \$350,000 in cash funds for the upcoming biennium. That is an authorization that will be...fees that will be collected by the developer, basically, or in some cases the compact during the next couple of years. It will be given out to the selection communities, the monitoring committees and the like. Basically, other than those two items, the budget is a continuation budget with no new programs and no decrease in programs. The next agency is Agency 23 which is on page 92 and it is the Department of Labor. Again, it is a code agency and the request was basically flat. A couple of small items that we did adjust other than just a continuation budget, we added a little money to the Amusement Ride Inspection program to bring that to a fully-funded inspector and we did eliminate some funding, a small amount of General Funds that was left in for the Farm Labor Contractor program on the idea that the amount of money that was there was not enough and that we should either fund it fully or not at all, and that request may be before you sometime later. The next agency is the Department of Motor Vehicles, Agency 24. It is on page 101. It has a large amount of General Funds and a large amount of Cash Funds. They print our license plates, if you will note, and what we have basically done there has been a flat continuation budget. A couple of small items that we did do, first of all, as we do in all of our agencies, we try to look at the Cash Fund balances that are available that are cash resources and try to use those up first, so if there is any way to reduce the General Fund expenditure, we maximize, if you will, the Cash Funds, and we did that in this agency for the first year because they have some cash fund balances, realizing that we had to increase the General Fund balance in the second year, and that is exactly what we have done. The license plates are being printed in this current fiscal year. They are going to be available January, 1990, and I think you all have seen a copy of the new license plate that is coming out. The only one little thing that we did do otherwise in that agency is dealing with motorcycle safety education. If you will recall, that is a program that has been funded by fees, but the funds have not been sufficient by fees
