

above there, for those of you that don't know, we do have a contract with Knox County for law enforcement on the Indian reservation, and they have a vehicle that they need...one of the vehicles that they need to replace has got over 150,000 miles on it, and we have put a small amount of funds in there for replacement over the next two years. The final thing is the Law Enforcement Training Center. It is out in Grand Island and that Law Enforcement Training Center, I am sure most of you know, is used by all of our law enforcement people in the state to train their personnel. It has been cash funded over the past several years, and is trying to stay cash funded. However, the funding is not enough to fully fund the facility any more. It has been dropping down and so we have put a small amount of money in the first year, \$26,000 of General Funds, and in the second year, \$122,000, to try to alleviate extra costs on the local municipalities and the counties for their law enforcement training. That completes the agencies that I have to present for you.
