

SPEAKER BARRETT: One minute.

SENATOR WARNER: ...and that was 18,000, but the thing that is significant in here, the actual General Fund appropriation is less than the current year, but it is done on the assumption based on the budget request that the enrollment is going to increase.

SENATOR SMITH: I remember hearing you say that.

SENATOR WARNER: And, therefore, generate more cash, and they will have problems if they do not have the kind of enrollment increase that they are anticipating, and those who have a concern, I'd suggest either it needs an amendment or it needs to have a mechanism that we recognize that. So what we have recommended essentially reflected in the way of enrollment that they expected.

SENATOR SMITH: Senator Warner, are you saying that if they are projecting an enrollment increase and that is where they are saying they are going to get some additional increase in their funding, and if they don't do that, if they don't have an increased enrollment, does that fall upon the state, then, to pick up that cost, that additional cost?

SPEAKER BARRETT: Time.

SENATOR WARNER: Not the way the budget is submitted, Senator Smith. We reduced the General Fund in anticipation of that occurring.

SENATOR SMITH: I see. Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Senator Nelson, did you have a question?

SENATOR NELSON: Mr. Speaker, yes, I did, of Senator Hannibal if he is available. If not, my question is this, maybe Senator Warner or someone else, how much does it cost to reissue license plates? It seems to me like I see the license plates on the car, it is not quite all that bad, and why are we reissuing them again? I think it is probably state statute, every four years.
