

vote. Again, the question is the adoption of the Hall and others amendment. Mr. Clerk, proceed.

CLERK: (Roll call vote read. See pages 1973-74 of the Legislative Journal.) 31 ayes, 12 nays, Mr. President, to adopt the amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The amendment is adopted and the call is raised. For the record.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a series of appointment letters from the Governor to be sent to the Reference Committee, and the Report of Registered Lobbyists for this week, Mr. President. And that's all that I have. (See pages 1974-77 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. To the next amendment.

CLERK: Senator Chambers would move to amend.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Chambers, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, this is an amendment that would seek a one-time appropriation of \$800,000 to be matched with \$200,000 in private funds to establish a minority student scholarship fund. Because there is information that I am acquiring and have not been able to make available to all the members, I am going to offer this amendment again on Select. But I do want to indicate to you that people, such as Coach Osborne, are in strong support of the proposition, in fact, he is going to commit personally a \$1,000, then \$5,000 a year out of the shoe contract that the school has. There are businessmen, such as the one who owns Godfather's in Omaha, Century Buick, people from the Chamber of Commerce, and individuals connected with the academic community who are in favor of the bill. By the time 813 gets to Select, I will have put a lot of that information on your desks and I will also give you some information compiled by the General Counsel for UN-L, Mr. Dick Wood, who has drafted some language that would make certain that this program comports with everything that even he could imagine would be required under certain Supreme Court decisions. I have not seen the surfacing of any opposition to the idea. I talked to one person who wants more information on the program itself. So rather than try to explain it one by one or all on the floor while the amendment is pending, I will
