they take a look at their own methods whereby, as Senator Lamb points out, they pit neighbor against neighbor on the bonus bidding, they take a look very seriously at their own management fees, their management expenses, which I think may be just a little bit greater than any professional manager would charge the school children of this state. I think we've raised a We're going to be helped, somewhat perhaps, number of issues. along that same line with a court decision in the future. that won't be the end of it, that's not going to be the end of it relative to the school lands. And we ought to be better prepared and better informed. It is a major asset, it's a major amount of money, and it is a major responsibility. It should not be addressed lightly, and it won't be. But I think we have served the people of the State of Nebraska and the school children well this afternoon for the hour and a half, or hour and 40 minutes that we debated this issue. And I would enjoy doing it again, and I encourage you all to become much better informed on it in the ensuing five, or six, or seven months before we come back here in January, when we might take another look at it. So, with that, Mr. President, I support the bracket motion and hope that we can move on to other issues.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The question is, shall the bill be bracketed? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the adoption of the motion to bracket the bill.

PRESIDENT: The bill is bracketed. Do you have anything for the record, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I do, Mr. President. Mr. President, notice of hearing from the Appropriations Committee and from the Health and Human Services Committee.
