Senator Labeledz did make an interesting point when she said that those at the university who were 19 or under, in order to obtain a measles shot, have to have signed permission from their parents. That does not mesh with this bill, because this is not a parental consent bill. A young woman cannot be required, by the law, to get permission from her parents to have an abortion, so we're not talking about the same things. You can inoculate somebody and the vaccine itself can produce the disease that it is designed to prevent. It's supposed to be a denatured, if you want to call it that, form of the virus or bacteria so that it cannot cause the disease, but it will trigger the production of antibodies, which will fight off the disease, should it attack. But sometimes the vaccine is not what it ought to be, so the school does not want that liability. The issues are entirely different. Senator Lynch hit the nail on the head when he talked about trying to compel children to talk to their parents about an issue that the children do not want to discuss with their parents. I won't go into the legalistic aspects of it, because that has been touched on. But I was taken also by Senator Crosby's discussion. She has mentioned, in depth, some of the things that our young people, as a matter of fact, do face. I talk to them all over the state and in their conventions and, Senator Wesely, bless him for this, is going to arrange for me to talk to the Boys State group again, and they want somebody to talk to them about sex. And, believe it or not, it is not always in the context of eroticism.
