SENATOR LABEDZ: I'd like to have a call of the house.

PRESIDENT: Okay. Question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Senator Labedz, did you ask for a roll call vote?

SENATOR LABEDZ: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Okay, I missed that. Thank you. Please record your presence. Pat, record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to go under call.

PRESIDENT: Okay, debate has ceased. Okay, that was the vote to go under call. We are under call. Please record your presence. Senator Labedz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Take call in.

PRESIDENT: All right. Call ins are authorized.

CLERK: Senator Withem changing from no to yes. Senator Wesely voting yes. Senator Peterson voting yes. Senator Lamb...

PRESIDENT: Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 4 nays, Mr. President, to cease debate.

PRESIDENT: Debate has ceased. Senator Lynch, would you like to close, please, on the bracketing of the bill.
