SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Could we have a call of the house and a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: Okay. The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 0 mays to go under call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The house is under call. Will you please record your presence. Those not in the Chamber, please return promptly so that we may continue. We're looking for Senator Abboud, Senator Lamb, Senator Schmit, Senator Korshoj. Senator Abboud.
