SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: If they don't, then we'll have to come back next year and see exactly what we want to do. But let's at least give the process a chance. I urge the support of this particular amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. You have heard the closing and the question is the adoption of the amendment offered by Senator Bernard-Stevens to LB 813. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: I hate to do it so early in the morning but, nonetheless, we...there is a possibility for a good amendment to pass and I hate to lose that opportunity so I will have a call of the house, please, and we'll, hopefully, just take call in votes if that will do it.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Shall the house go under call? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 1 nay to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The house is under call. Members, please record your presence. Return to your seats. There has been a request for a roll call vote. While we're waiting for members to return to the Chamber, Senator Scott Moore has a guest under the south balcony, Mr. Jim Friesen from Henderson, Nebraska. Mr. Friesen, would you please stand and take a bow. Thank you. Glad to have you with us. Senator Wesely, please, record your presence. Senator Withem. Senators Beyer and Byars. Senators Schmit and McFarland, please record your presence. Senator Nelson, please record your presence. Senator Bernard-Stevens, would you care to vote. Thank you. The question is the adoption of the Bernard-Stevens amendment. Members, take your seats for a roll call vote. We have had a request for the voting in reverse order. Call the roll, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote read. See pages 2044-45 of the Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 13 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The amendment is adopted. The call is raised. The next item, Mr. Clerk.
