CLERK: Senator, I think it's parole salaries, if that helps any.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, parole...oh, yes, all right, I wanted to be sure that I'm on the right one.

CLERK: It's AM1636, Senator, AM1636.

SPEAKER BARRETT: (Gavel.)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Clerk, would you read the amounts of the salary because I thought I had it printed but apparently I didn't.

CLERK: Well, it's printed on page 2011, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, page 2011. Thank you.

CLERK: And if my reading is correct, I think we're looking at around \$23,000 or thereabouts, Senator, is that consistent?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm going to have to pass over this one also and get my papers together.

SPEAKER BARRETT: So be it.

CLERK: Senator Chambers, I now have your amendment, Senator, on the minority student scholarship fund. (The Chambers amendment appears on page 2015 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That one, I will take.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Proceed.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Members of the Legislature, I am having a packet of several letters passed around to you from those who are supporting this proposal. The resolution that was adopted this morning, as I indicated, stated some of the findings that had been made by the university relative to the need for such a program. They gave actual statistical information to substantiate the numerical and statistical underrepresentation of the minority students on the campuses, both at the University of Nebraska at Lincoln and in Omaha. What this amendment would
