While we are assembling, may I introduce some guests, please. Under the north balcony, Senator Langford has some guests there from Ravenna, Nebraska, Sherri Cords, Jennifer Hongsermeier, Deb Hervert, and Judy Strate. Would you folks please stand and be recognized. Thank you for visiting us today. We are looking for Senator Moore. Senator Warner, please would you record your presence. Senator Schmit, Senator Hefner, Senator Haberman, Senator Goodrich. We are voting on the Hall amendment. Call in votes were authorized.

CLERK: Senator Withem voting yes. Senator Coordsen voting no. Senator Chizek voting yes.

PRESIDENT: A roll call vote has been requested. We are looking for Senators Goodrich and Haberman. Now we are looking for Senator Haberman. I understand Senator Haberman is on his way

SENATOR HALL: We can go ahead. I am sorry.

PRESIDENT: Okay, the question is the adoption of the Hall amendment. Roll call vote has been requested. Will you please take your seats so we may begin. Please return to your desk so we may begin.
