CLERK: ... the next amendment I have is by Senator Haberman.

PRESIDENT: It is passed over.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a priority motion. Senator Bernard-Stevens would move to reconsider.

PRESIDENT: Senator Bernard-Stevens, please.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Mr. President. This is a reconsideration motion for the body, and I will not take more than 30 seconds as I promised Senator Coordsen. This is on the aquaculture reconsideration. There were... I did a poor job yesterday of communicating to people and talking with people on floor for various reasons. I apologize for that. talking with people on the floor, there is considerable for the measure, otherwise, I wouldn't waste the body's time for this measure. So I'm asking the body to reconsider the aquaculture vote today and then we'll, hopefully then, agree to aquaculture amendment which would put a specialist at the University of Nebraska for \$50,000 in order to give the expertise necessary to the people out in central and western Nebraska who are considerable in number, who are trying to in their own investment into aquaculture but they would like to have someone in the state who is a specialist who can come out and tell them what exactly do they need to do in their particular system... (End of tape, no overlap. Some debate lost.)

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. President and members, you know for all of the members of the body that have been here at least as long as I've been here, three years in the Legislature, you know obviously this is a program that I like. This is a program that was contained in my priority bill of three years ago. know that half a million dollars that Senator Rod Johnson got added into the budget yesterday was probably one of my highest priorities last year, the things I like to do. The fact of the matter is you can't do everything you want to do. It's as simple as that. And there is only...on General File so far we've increased the budget for the next fiscal year by, you another \$2.4 million, only \$2.4 million in light of the great surplus we have here in the state. Those \$2.4 million that comes out of something, obviously. It either comes out of the reserve or eventually comes out of somebody's hide. Now the
