SENATOR LABEDZ: Say the...ask the question again, I'm sorry.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: When does the doctor have to give the notification to the authorities?

SENATOR LABEDZ: After the abortion is performed, I'm sure. He can do it before, either way.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How long? I meant, what is the time frame?

SENATOR LABEDZ: At that very day.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Where do you see that?

SENATOR LABEDZ: It doesn't say but if he wants to perform the abortion, which he is allowed to do, if there is sexual abuse or neglect, he can perform the abortion immediately but then he must notify the authorities of the abuse.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. But may I finish my statement so I won't lose it here. There is no time frame mentioned during which the physician must give notification so if he never gives it, they can't prove that he didn't intend to give it.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Labedz, your light is on.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Are you asking a question...oh, sorry.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Labedz, this is your time.

SENATOR LABEDZ: I'm sorry. I call the question.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. Shall debate now cease? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to cease debate.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Debate ceases. Senator Chambers, to close.
