Unauthorized personnel, please leave the floor. The house is under call. Senator Haberman, please record your presence. Senator Elmer, please. Senator Conway, would you please check in. Senator Ashford, please record your presence. Senator Bernard-Stevens, please. Senator McFarland. Senator McFarland, would you please check in? Senator Smith, the house is under call. Senator Bernard-Stevens. Senator Byars, the house is under call. Members, please return to your seats for a vote on the motion to suspend the rules. Senator Hall, would you please check in. Did you ask for a roll call, Senator Labeledz, or not?

SENATOR LABEDZ: Don't I have the opportunity to close?

SPEAKER BARRETT: Call in votes are authorized.

SENATOR LABEDZ: I didn't have the opportunity to close. I just asked for a call of the house.

SPEAKER BARRETT: We are attempting to cease debate, I believe, are we not, Senator Labeledz?

SENATOR LABEDZ: Yes. Oh, I am sorry.

SPEAKER BARRETT: And you have authorized call in votes I believe.
