SENATOR LABEDZ: Yes.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Please proceed, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Byars voting yes.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Record, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Debate has ceased. Senator Labeledz, would you care to close, Senator Labeledz?

SENATOR LABEDZ: Senator Chambers moves that the call be raised. I also request that the call be raised.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The call is raised.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Satisfactory, Senator Chambers?

SPEAKER BARRETT: Proceed, Senator Labeledz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: I made the motion to suspend the rules. For those of you who were not on the floor, at the time I made the request, there are amendments on file, at least one that I know of. I am asking for 30 votes to suspend the rules. There is ample time, I am sure there is going to be more amendments on LB 769, to do that on Select File. We have debated LB 769, and someone mentioned that it has taken more time than LB 775, and I totally agree. It has, and it probably will even longer when we come to Select File, and even on Final Reading. But I am suggesting that you suspend the rules now and I will make a motion without any statement whatsoever to advance LB 769 to Select File. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. And the question is, shall the rules be suspended? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record. A roll call vote has been requested. Mr. Clerk, please proceed with the roll call vote on the motion to suspend the rules.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2067 of the Legislative Journal.) 28 ayes, 16 nays, Mr. President, on the suspension.
