PRESIDENT: The call is...the house is under call. Will you please record your presence. Those not in the Chamber, please return and record their presence promptly. While we're waiting for some of our members to return, may I introduce some guests, please. In the north balcony, Senator Conway has 23 seventh grade students from Emerson Hubbard School and we also have two foreign exchange students, one from Brazil and one from Columbia, and their teachers. Would you teachers and students please stand so we may recognize you? Thank you for visiting us today. Senator Rogers also has some guests in the north balcony. We have 14 students from Elba and their teacher...let's see, they're seventh and eighth grade students, and their teachers. Would you folks please stand and be recognized. And thank you for visiting us today. We're looking for Senator Bernard-Stevens, Senator Robak, Senator Chambers, Senator Haberman, Senator Labeledz, Senator Landis, Senator Lindsay, Senator Lynch, Senator Peterson, Senator Pirsch and Senator Schmit. We're looking for Senator Lynch and Senator Pirsch. Senator Lynch is here and the report is that Senator Pirsch is sprinting on her way to the Chamber. The question is the adoption of the Hall amendment. Would you please vote. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 13 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.
