

med center, or they come out of the General Fund or the Building Fund, those monies are spent, and there is no guarantees. They can finish that day, take down the scaffolding, wash the building off, pull out of the parking lot, and if it falls down, nobody is responsible. There is no guarantees based on what we have got in Section 8 of LB 812. Nobody will guarantee it, and why? Because the kinds of studies that I asked for on Select File haven't been done. This isn't going to pass. I think what possibly...I don't think it is going to jeopardize the rest of the bill, but it is clearly, as long as this is a portion of LB 812, I can't support the entire part of the bill, and I am not going to ask the body to vote on it again, but I clearly want them to know that this is a provision in the bill that is more than just fixing a problem. It is a clear policy decision and, Senator Abboud, oftentimes we don't agree, but this issue you stated with regard to our past experience with some of these same types of structures is one that...it is a record that we should not be very proud of, and I hope to God, Senator Hannibal, that you are right, that since 1976 procedures have been put in place that guarantee that this type of thing does not take place again. Mr. President, with that, I would withdraw the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is withdrawn. Do you have anything else on it, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Withem would move to bracket LB 812 until Monday, May 8.

PRESIDENT: Senator Withem, please.

SENATOR WITHEM: Yes, Mr. President, and members of the body, I am really on a horse of dilemma. I really don't know what to do. I was a second ago criticizing the university for being slow in getting their information before us. They have just been one-upped in that regard. I just, as we were debating the Hall amendment, received a response to my request from an Attorney General's Opinion on LB 812, Section 11, the different issue, the other issue that we were dealing with, which is, and I am having that opinion circulated at this point, if you remember, Section 11 of the bill. We were debating the student, the SSIG program, and the Scholarship Assistance Program, and the potential creation of a new program by this appropriations bill in those other debates. We asked a request of the Attorney General when the bill was back on General File and it was just
