SPEAKER BARRETT: Discussion on the Lindsay amendment, Senator Chambers, followed by Senators Abboud and Lynch.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Lindsay a question. Senator Lindsay, when did you become aware of the existence of 28-347?

SENATOR LINDSAY: I believe, well, the existence of the statute, I have known it was I guess there but there had been some question as far as whether it was in effect. As far as finding out that it still was in effect, I guess yesterday.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And who brought that to your attention and raised the questions?

SENATOR LINDSAY: I believe it was the senator from the 11th District, possibly the senator from the 6th District.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The senator from the 11th District didn't mention that, all credit goes to Senator "Ash Bradford" so that we have it clear...I meant Senator Brad Ashford so it is clear in the record. That is all I want to ask you at this point, but a portion of your amendment I will have a question or two about. Members of the Legislature, Senator Lindsay is a young man, and as he stated correctly, a prudent person. Having had the issues raised that I so meticulously, correctly, intelligently, and inescapably raised, he had no choice being a prudent person other than to accede to the correctness, intelligence, wisdom, inescapability of my questions, the questions I raised, and offered an amendment. I cannot fault him for that. As a matter of fact, if a person is on this floor and information comes from any source that would indicate existing legislation or proposed legislation is not in the form it should be in to accomplish the intended purpose, no matter how much crow has to be eaten, no matter how many I told you sos a person would have to hear, prudence would mandate that that person offer the appropriate amendatory language. That is what Senator Lindsay has done, and because I think that is a commendable position to take, not just on this bill but in the process of legislating, I am not going to rub his face in anything as I threatened him the other day I intended to do. I was hoping that because of his youthfulness, his naivete, his moisture behind the ears, I could intimidate him by threatening to embarrass him on the floor out of doing
