

the record, Mr. Clerk? Mr. Clerk, the next item.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next bill for consideration this morning is LB 814. It's a bill introduced by the Appropriations Committee and signed by its membership. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on April 21st, Mr. President. It was referred directly to General File.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Senator Warner, please, would you introduce the bill, make an opening statement and then we'll go to the amendments.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, LB 814 is the recommendations on capital construction. The totals, if you still have the light colored blue book which is easier to probably follow, on page 142 is the total amounts of appropriations of General Fund cash or other funds that are suggested. On page 143 of that book is the various issues, various construction projects that are outlined. And on page 144 and 145 contains the reaffirmations in the bill. Reaffirmations are those projects that are previously authorized, not yet completed and the continued funding of what has already been authorized into the following period for which we are budgeting. And a summary by agency is on page 146 through 171 of requests and whether or not they were approved or not approved by the Governor and whether they were recommended or not recommended by the Appropriations Committee and in the amount. Because of the number of amendments that are up there, I suspect I will save time if I make no further explanation at this point and we proceed to dealing with those amendments that the body wishes to and then we can talk individual projects probably and save a lot of time.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Before proceeding to the first amendment, Senator Lindsay has some guests in the north balcony, Rosemary Reinsch and family, Karissa, Marshall, Kevin, Mary and Austin. Would you folks please stand and take a bow. Thank you. We're happy to have you. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Bernard-Stevens but, Senator, I understand you want to withdraw that at this time.
