government where we collect the money and then, in fact, try to provide some property tax relief. The major purpose for a property tax relief bill is to provide noticeable relief, noticeable relief, and, 'adies and gentlemen, I am concerned at this point that LB 84, with all of the various givens, may not provide noticeable tax relief. Those are just some of the obvious factors. At this point, I think that you have a very...Senator Lamb has a very valid concern,...

SPEAKER BARRETT: Time.

SENATOR SCHMIT: ... and I think that perhaps maybe that concern is not misplaced.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Before recognizing Senator Conway, I am please to announce that Senator Dennis Byars has guests in the north balcony, ten junior high students with their sponsor from Beatrice Junior High School. Would you people please stand and be recognized. Also Senator Jacklyn Smith has 32 sixth graders from Kenesaw Elementary School with their sponsors in the north balcony. Would you folks please stand. Thank you, we are very pleased to have you students and your sponsors and your teachers visiting with us this afternoon. Senator Conway.

SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. By virtue of the fact that I have just once again looked over the amended version of 84 that will be being offered shortly by the coalition of good fellows, they reiterated, they reiterated in Section 20 the reverse severability clause that I am discussing at this point. So if I had my votes to have my way at this point and then we adopt this amendment, which I hope will be adopted, that is in it again and so it would then unravel what I have just done, so I would like to withdraw at this time and I will be replacing the severability question after the new white copy is adopted to the bill. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Senator Conway, you had the next motion, Senator. This is your amendment that you had printed on 2067 of the Journal.

SENATOR CONWAY: I would like to withdraw that, please.
