here, and they all in lock step trotted right over there to that corner of the building. I was listening to public radio the other day, and some men were explaining who in drafting the Constitution why women were not given the vote. They make all kinds of jokes about things like this, and he justified it by saying that nature has given women so much power that the government should give them as little as possible. The Governor demonstrated her power in reducing these individuals to whatever they were reduced to, and it also made me think of that expression, we will all hang together or, most assuredly, all hang separately. If you hang together or separately, what is the difference. You are going to hang in either case. That is one of those nonsensical statements that people always make, that if you don't analyze it, it seems to be saying something but it says nothing. Now I want to get into a portion of this amendment. On the first page at the bottom, there is a wealth of incorrect material here. Starting in line 19, it says, "The Property Tax Relief Act will reduce the property tax burden...", it should say, the real property tax burden and certain classes of personal property, so they are wrong there. ...for the citizens of Nebraska...", you don't have to be a citizen of this state to benefit from the property tax. You can be a resident. You can have interests here that are taxed. So I don't think it goes just to citizens of this state but whoever would have property tax bill in this state, and if I am wrong, they can stop me. And it says, "...the reduction will be for the public good." And Senator Hall knows how I fee about that. It is not for the public good ...

SPEAKER BARRETT: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...unless you are going to take that small little group and say they constitute the public, and Senator Hall was mistaken to give all renters to me. He made it sound like I am a landlord. I am a landless lord, Baron Hefner. He is kind of looking up over to make sure I wasn't encroaching on his domains, but I was told, Senator Hall, by a number of other senators that they have renters, too, so they are not all mine. But I do have concern about the fact that renters are disregarded, that the money that is going to be plundered for this purpose was partially put there by those who pay income tax and sales tax and tax on automobiles, and some of those will gain no benefits whatsoever from this. So we know that it is a highly politicized bill, a highly political move, and I am going to watch it play out, but there are a couple of very minor
