amendments that I want that will at least bring some truth to the protestations that this bill makes.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Abboud.

SENATOR ABBOUD: Yes, Mr. President, I would like to give my time to Senator Haberman.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, may I address a question to Senator Lamb, please?

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Lamb, would you respond?

SENATOR LAMB: Yes, sir.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Lamb, what is it going to cost to administer this bill, dollars and cents, please?

SENATOR LAMB: Let me get that.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Moore, while Senator Lamb is looking for the question, can you answer the question?

SENATOR MOORE: No, off the top of my head, I...

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Hall, can you answer the question? How much is it going to cost to administer this bill?

SENATOR HALL: Senator, what is your name, Senator Haberman, very little, and the reason for that, Senator Haberman, is that we used the current system that the assessors and the treasurers have in place for the homestead exemption and to provide for the reduction with regard to the 8.5 percent.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Lamb, do you agree with that? What the three of you are saying then it is going to cost a little bit or nothing to administer this bill?

SENATOR HALL: Negligible.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Negligible. That is just great. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Scofield, Senator Hall on deck.
