it one year and one year only, and because of the fact that we're not going to solve the problem permanently this year we're going to recognize the fact that with some of that money that we do have it's not wise to build it into the base. A one time expenditure we're going to fund the first year, next year we're going to come back and maybe permanently work on something like 611.

PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR MOORE: Maybe we'll extend this one more year. But you know just because you have some frustrations with LB 84 and it's not perfect, and just because some people have frustrations over the fact that there was a few of us that were involved in this from the beginning, you know this hasn't been exclusive to property by any means. This whole bettle between the gang of four and the Governor's been on the front page of the paper, and there's nothing been covert about this at all. It's been high, high profile. I guess it's frustrating that we keep getting chastised for working on this. And I think, you know, yes, it's one time, that's what money there is the e now. No, it's not a permanent solution, I don't want it to be a permanent solution. If it was a permanent solution then I'd be voting against it. But you know I understand Senator Wesely's frustrations. Maybe I don't totally understand why he's now all of a sudden against this property tax relief bill, but I urge you to oppose Senator Wesely's amendment and hopefully yet this afternoon we can dispose of the remaining amendments to LB 84, and then, you know, ...

PRESIDENT: Time.

SENATOR MOORE: ...it isn't...we can still work on this, it's not written in stone. If we find some things we have to do, we'll do them.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. May I introduce some guests in the north balcony who are guests of Senator Elmer. We have 21 fourth graders from Beaver City, Nebraska and their teacher. Would you folks please stand and be recognized by the Legislature. Thank you for visiting us today. Senator Lamb, please, followed by Senator Elmer.

SENATOR LAMB: Question, please.
