Senator Haberman, would you return to your desk and record your presence, please. Then we can start on the roll call vote. Still looking for Senator Moore and Senator Robak. Here we are. Now the question, ladies and gentlemen, is shall debate cease? And a roll call vote has been requested. Please remain in your seats. Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: (Roll call vote read. See pages 2145-46 of the Legislative Journal.) 30 ayes, 5 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to cease debate.

PRESIDENT: Debate has ceased. The call is raised. Senator Chambers, would you like to close on your amendment to the amendment?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, the Old Testament had a favorite expression, whenever a great battle was to be waged the term was, "gird up the loins of your mind". That's what we have done. I don't know what it means, Senator Lynch, I'm just quoting. It is a quote, Senator Landis. It is a quote. Members of the Legislature, Senator Lynch, the other day, mentioned how innocent he is of various activities but he has his way. This amendment is one which does a very specific and easy to understand thing. It makes the language in the penalty clause...or the penalty section consistent with the language in the bill itself and the language in the committee amendment. Instead of saying, "any person" who violates this act, it says, "any physician or attending physician". Senator Lindsay has said that he agrees with the amendment and I felt that he would because he is making an effort to try to bring a silk purse out of a sow's ear. Senator Carson Rogers, with one of his friends, tried literally to do that several years ago. It wasn't successful but the effort was undertaken and now we know that it is impossible as again the Bible said, Senator Landis, to bring a silk purse out of a sow's ear. Senator Lindsay, nevertheless, being young, a child of a new, high tech age, is not willing to accept that which has been accepted unchallenged for so many
