overruled? A roll call vote has been requested. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote. See page 2147 of the Legislative Journal.) 10 ayes, 29 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to overrule the Chair.

PRESIDENT: The Chair is not overruled. The call is raised.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have to the bill, I have two priority motions. The first priority motion is a motion to reconsider the motion to suspend the rules as found on Journal page 2066. I also have a bracket motion, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Since we have two motions which are of high priority, I will take the stance that the reconsider motion is higher than the bracketing motion. Don't see anything in the rules that says one is higher than the other. Rule 7, Section (b), every motion to reconsider shall take preference over all other questions except a motion to adjourn. So apparently a reconsider is higher than bracket. Mr. Clerk, proceed on the reconsider.

CLERK: Mr. President, the motion I have is by Senator Rogers. Senator Rogers would move to reconsider the motion to suspend the rules as found in the Journal on page 2066. That motion was offered by Senator Labedz on May 3. It would suspend Rule 6, Section 3, Rule 7, Section 3 and vote on the advancement of LB 769 without further amendment or debate.

PRESIDENT: Senator Rogers, please.

SENATOR ROGERS: Mr. President and members, I haven't talked very, very little about this bill. I want to make a few comments and then I'll turn the rest of my time over to Senator Labedz. You know, I can truthfully say that I've been to a lot of meetings in my area also and I found a lot of support for the bill, maybe not 100 percent but I've heard some of these senators say they go back and they only have one person or something like that, pretty hard for me to believe. With all the debate we've heard the last few days, you know, I haven't heard anyone, now I mean anyone, talk about the rights of that little baby in a mother's womb. I mean, I guess I just can't understand the thinking of some of the people around here that are deathly trying to harass the bill, probably trying to kill it. I mean, we've got all these lawyers and all these people
