CLERK: I have a quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT NICHOL PRESIDING

PRESIDENT: We will go to number nine, LB 814, please.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 814 is the capital construction bill that was introduced by the Appropriations Committee. The bill was referred directly to General File, Mr. President. The bill was discussed, I believe, last week briefly. Mr. President, I have a series of amendments. The first amendment I have is by Senator Schmit.

PRESIDENT: Is anyone prepared to handle Senator Schmit's amendment to the bill? Do you have other amendments, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, I do. I now have an amendment from Senators Hartnett and Korshoj. The amendment is on page 2124. Senator, I understand you would like to withdraw and perhaps substitute?

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yes, please, if I could.

PRESIDENT: Would you like to...

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yes.

PRESIDENT: ...withdraw and substitute?

SENATOR HARTNETT: And the one I do, I think for the people on the Appropriations Committee is that it would...want to strike Section 26 rather than Section...or 25 rather than 26, and so forth.

PRESIDENT: Okay, just a moment. Is there any objection to Senator Hartnett withdrawing and substituting? If not, proceed, Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. President, members of the body, this amendment of mine to LB 814 I think simply essentially goes back to what the Governor had proposed in her capital construction budget with the exception of the one section that I want to strike, Section 25, and I think it is being passed out to you now, what the savings are for the different years, this year,
