SENATOR HANNIBAL: The total program at York?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: For program activities. I meant those things that will help the women either learn a skill or give them counseling or the things that are necessary to assist them in becoming productive citizens.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Senator Chambers, I don't have the answer to that question, specifically. We have operational budgets that are within the corrections department and, certainly, the Center for Women at York would have rehabilitation programs there within their facility but I don't know the number attached directly to that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Can you tell me exactly what will be done with this four hundred and something thousand dollars?

SENATOR HANNIBAL: I can try.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.
