I think this is exactly the wrong kind of response to it and I think there should be no money given to build this facility. This is where we need to do a study to determine whether alternate sentencing...

SPEAKER BARRETT: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...for the disparate sentencing being corrected could make a difference, look at the internal disciplinary procedure, how that impacts on the parole activities and then we will have an idea of how to attack this problem comprehensively. Make the system serve as a tool of improvement. But when you can look at five or six causes that contribute to an effect and you decide to do something that deals with no one of those causes then it's clear that the effect is going to continue to be there. This construction will not alleviate overcrowding and the Director had to acknowledge it. So I cannot understand why the Appropriations Committee decided that the largest expenditure in this budget and the next largest would be that correctional facility in Lincoln. They require a study before that's going to be built but this one...

SPEAKER BARRETT: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...where it's clear it's not going to touch overcrowding will be built without any study. I'm in favor of removing this expenditure from the budget.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Hannibal, do you care to discuss the matter?

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and members of the Legislature, I will rise to oppose the amendment and, again, I would address...or ask that you look on page 16 of the budget book and it does give a...it does give a description of what we're talking about. It's an 80-bed department owned control unit. As Senator Chambers has talked about, it is an expenditure over the next two years of \$4.5 million and will have an annual cost, after it's built, of \$518,000. The reason why, I think, it was addressed to not only in the Appropriations Committee in the hearing but also to the Judiciary Committee and their hearing, which I attended, the facility suffers...the current facility of 36 beds suffers from a lack of space, number
