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able to feel more satisfaction as far as the capability to meet with their families without all the kinds of problems that we heard about in that committee, maybe we wouldn't have so many of those folks that needed this other adjustment.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Are you asking me a question?

SENATOR SMITH: No, I guess I'm making a statement.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Oh.

SENATOR SMITH: I guess what I would like to do is...Senator Hall, did you get any more information than what we talked about on that issue?

SENATOR HALL: No, Senator Smith, I did not. I don't have...still looking for the study that they...the Department of Corrections sent to us, about two months late and only after we requested it. But we're still looking for it. So, no, I didn't get the numbers that they submitted for that minor construction to expand the visiting area.

SENATOR SMITH: But in your...in your memory, I think you indicated to me that it was much higher than we thought it really should have been.

SENATOR HALL: Yeah, I thought it was kind of ridiculous, actually, the amount of money that they thought would be necessary to basically break a hole in the wall...

SPEAKER BARRETT: One minute.

SENATOR HALL: ...and provide some carpeting. It was in the six-figure range and that was just over at the Penitentiary. And then there was monies that were needed to enclose an area at OCC, as well, and then also to look at any provisions that would be made available out at York.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you. I just feel some frustration my own self on this issue that they even bothered to come to the Appropriations Committee and make that kind of request. And you say they haven't, they have only asked for staff, more increased staff so they could have longer visitation hours. They did not ever request appropriations for the expansion of that recreation facility to meet the needs that they have there, that we saw
