probably won't, then I'm going to try again on Select. I'm going to try to have more information because I definitely want some additional things in the record. I am surprised that Mr. Gunter could come to the Appropriations Committee, that is so tight-fisted on other things, and tell them, I need to more than double the size of the hole and the Appropriations Committee, not in unison, all right, you say need it, you got it. It's not justified. And I hope that we will vote to take this proposition out and there should be an objective study by an outside agency, not even the legislative staff, but an agency that understands the area of corrections and the one to do the study should not be selected by the Department of Corrections.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The question is to strike original Section 19. Again, if you would care to delete, vote yes; if not, vote no. The house is under call, Senator Chambers. Please, members, will you please check in. Record your presence. Senator Schimek, please. Thank you. Senator Goodrich. Senator Conway, the house is under call. Senator Conway, the house is under call. Thank you. Did you ask for a roll call? I...thank you. Mr. Clerk, proceed with the roll call.

CLERK: (Roll call vote read. See page 2167 of the Legislative Journal.) 22 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.
