

\$10 million building the facilities. I don't see it. It is not in my nature to sell prisons on this floor. I'd much rather use that money for a myriad of other ways. I just don't see any alternatives. To Senator Smith's question about recreation and why we haven't handled those visitor facilities, we had 12 requests prioritized to us. We are talking about four of them on this bill, the four facilities. We have handled by committee in this bill item number one, which was the number one, was the York facility for women. We have given an okay to that. Number two, we had air conditioning for Kearney. We elected to bypass air conditioning for the Youth Development Center at Kearney. We went to priority three, which was the adjustment center we just talked about.

SPEAKER BARRETT: One minute.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Priority four was for rehabilitation services through the corrections, the correctional services. This is where you put people involved in industry vocational training. We did \$713,000 with the revolving funds there. Item five, the same kind of facilities at York, \$310,000 with the revolving funds for there. Priority number six, again, the same thing, rehabilitative services through correctional industries; an additional \$200,000 revolving funds for the, where was it, the Nebraska State Penitentiary in the braille program. So for correctional facilities, correctional services, we did a million, two there. Now the next item is the Omaha Correctional Facility. The next item after that is the Lincoln Correctional Facility. My point is, to you, we granted eight out of the first 12 of the priorities. The only one we left out was air conditioning at Kearney. Now we didn't get on this list more visitor's space. We got it through the operations budget. Again, it was an expansion.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Time.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: They chose not to do it.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, the whole issue on corrections is one of growing population, and I suspect that in many respects the suggestion from the Appropriations Committee is not all that significantly different from others because the third and largest project, which was the
