SENATOR MOORE: For purposes of explanation, now if you voted yes that time, you should vote yes again, because if you don't do that, then you go back to ground zero, and the whole \$3.4 million is in. So that is understood, what you are doing with the amendment is all that is still left now is the planning money this year, reinstated all that language in that amendment, but if you defeat the amendment now, if the amendment is not adopted now, then it goes back to \$3.4 million. That is where we are now.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: (Response inaudible.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. Shall debate cease? Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, please.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 5 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Debate ceases. Senator Hartnett, any closing comments? Thank you. The question is, and here again, we are striking a Section, if you care to strike vote yes, if you want to leave it as is, vote no. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay.

SENATOR LYNCH: A point of personal privilege. In your own inimitable and unique...

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: ...would you please explain...

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Lynch, excuse me, we are in the process of taking a vote. May I ask you to wait with that point. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 13 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the Senator Hartnett's amendment as amended.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The amendment is adopted. Senator Lynch, please.
