SENATOR HANNIBAL: Senator Hartnett, all...all engineers and architectural firms have to put their seal on their designs and they have to...they guarantee the construction, they guarantee the design. If, for some reason, that would have a failure, they are the liable people, and by taking on this project, the Daly Company would be in that position and they know that and they understand that and they agreed to it.

SENATOR HARTNETT: They're going to sign, yeah, they're going to sign...or they do right now, is that it? I don't, you know, I'm not a...

SENATOR HANNIBAL: It's a matter of current law.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah, okay.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: It was a law before except that the statute of limitations ran out.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah. Thank you, Senator Hannibal.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Nelson, please, followed by Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR NELSON: I will only take just a very few minutes. I, too, took the opportunity to attend the presentation that the university gave on the College of Pharmacy and I was convinced that it's a heck of a situation to be into but I don't know what else we're going to do about it and I do appreciate Senator Withem very much going into this a little more in depth and helping us out on what we should or should not do. There was one question that I have always had in my mind. Senator Schmit, would you respond to a question, please? You mentioned the other day that this same construction company now have been contracted to build the coliseum at Kearney. Am I correct on that?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Well, I would prefer that Senator Hannibal would answer that question. There is something...there is a company which was involved in the construction of the pharmacy college which is involved in the construction of the coliseum at Kearney and I'm not sure what phase of it, senator.
