SENATOR WITHEM: Yes, maybe...I have a question for...it seems like Senator Hannibal is the manager for this...I don't...if he...

SENATOR HANNIBAL: They're coming from the Medical Center's budget...or the university's budget. They're...we call them in-house costs.

SENATOR WITHEM: Okay. So they're coming from the university's budget?

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Already, yes.

SENATOR WITHEM: Okay, already, and what the Moore amendment will do will be another million dollars will be coming from within the university's budget?

SENATOR HANNIBAL: That's correct.
