

up there, theoretically. I don't know if that's quite exactly corollary and quite exactly true but that possibility sure exists. But I think with the amendment in this form, the Legislature is saying, yes, it needs to be built; yes, we're going to come up with half of it but we're going to pay half of it out of General Fund. In the meantime we will, hopefully, continue to work with the Med Center in finding the most efficient way to deal with the problem and at the same time trying to make sure that we found everybody responsible for these mistakes. I don't think...I'm not convinced we've done all that yet. And I just ask for adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of the Moore amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay.

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. President, I would ask that everybody check in and have a roll call vote.

In the north balcony, we have 35 fourth graders from Lincoln and their teachers. They're from St. John's Catholic School in Lincoln. Would you folks, teachers and students, please stand and be recognized by the Legislature. Thank you for visiting us today. We're waiting for Senator Haberman and Senator McFarland.

SENATOR MOORE: Let's go ahead and go. I mean, if...is he on his way?

PRESIDENT: Senator McFarland is on his way. Can't locate Senator Haberman at the moment. It's okay to go ahead, Senator Moore? The question is the adoption of the Moore amendment.
