

continue to have 20 votes for their amendments. They would get very close on one, almost be able to grasp the gold ring as you're going around on the merry-go-round but miss it, that the next step would be to try to keep the bill from passing with the emergency clause, that we would succeed in keeping it from passing with the emergency clause, and then the next step is also predictable, that a member of the committee would stand and say, oh, but wait a minute, we have to have the emergency clause, not because of all of these things that you've been talking about so far, but because of all of these other important issues that have not warranted more than a couple of minutes of discussion on the floor up until now. Suddenly, these are becoming incredibly important that have to be passed immediately. Well, I guess my response to that is I'm sorry, I'm sorry for those other programs but I'm not the one that drafted a bill that put a controversial item in the bill that may not have 33 votes to pass. I'm not the one that's bringing down these other things because I didn't draft this bill. If the...if...they should have known that the Pharmacy College would be a controversial item, that there may not be 33 votes to get it passed. So what happens is it gets stuck into a bill that has other things in it and we can now say, oh, they just got to pass, all of a sudden, and then get the 33 votes to pass with the emergency clause the Pharmacy College. If nothing else, maybe the additional 90 days that they can...that they will have to wait will let them sit down and discuss with Daly as to whether Daly has the best solution out there. Maybe...maybe somebody other than somebody that's on the payroll for the University of Nebraska can have an idea that might be worthy of consideration. I know it's unlikely but it's possible. It's possible. Maybe these other 90 days will give them a chance to consider that. Now as far as the other things, the renal program, the other things that may be in this bill, I'm perfectly content and excited and pleased and all those other good adjectives to work with people to find other ways of getting them to pass with the E clause. You know, we've got...on Final Reading, we've got 40 or 50 A bills. I would be happy to help amend some of those that do have the E clause to put these other things that have to pass on them. There are other ways of passing the renal program with the E clause, other than reconsideration of 812. And I think there are still enough legitimate questions about the Pharmacy College that we do not need to reconsider passage of 812. This is not an either reconsider or the poor renal program is going to die. That's not factually true. There are other ways of dealing with it and
