to carry that beyond us and carry it to the pharmacy students or the students of the university or, in the case of patient revenues paying for something, to the patients of the center, and I don't believe you need to carry it on to the other parts of the bill. I will tell you there may be a way with time running out in the session, I don't know, but if there is a way, if this fails, I will try to take care of some of these other provisions because they, obviously, need to be done. But to vote against the E clause is to just say, no to the pharmacy school completely. That's the same thing. If that's what you want to do, that's fine. If you want to bash the Appropriations Committee, I would recommend that you wait and do that this afternoon on LB 814 some more and wait on a lot of other issues on LB 813, and we have four or five or six other bills coming, you will have ample opportunity to do that. Take it out on me, take it out on the committee, take it out on your frustrations there, don't take it out on this bill. I would hope that you would reconsider and I believe, Mr. President, that it does take 33 votes to reconsider the motion. That's it.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall the bill be reconsidered? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. It does take 33 votes. Those of you who are not in your seats, please return to them so that we may continue. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 9 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to reconsider the bill without the emergency clause (sic).

PRESIDENT: Now the question is, shall LB 812 pass with the emergency clause attached? Debatable. It's not debatable. Mr. Clerk. Senator Goodrich. How many are excused, Mr. Clerk? Three are excused. All right, let's have a check in.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Check in and roll call.

PRESIDENT: Okay. Now, please record your presence. Please look up to see if your light is on. Please remain in your seat so we can keep track of you. It makes it...it's distracting when we're trying to...Senator Nelson, thank you. Senator Ashford, would you record your presence, please. Thank you. All are here that are not excused. Now we're going to have a roll call and the question is, shall LB 812 pass with the emergency clause attached? Mr. Clerk.
