Senator Hall. Senator Hall, please.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, members, I would just ask Senator Warner a question with regard to these, if he would respond.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner, please.

SENATOR HALL: Senator Warner, what qualifies, how do you break them out? I mean, for example, there has got to be provisions within operating that allows for the university to replace, for example, a light or something that breaks within a classroom or a laboratory. But yet...is this a total remodeling, or is there some threshold that has to be met in order to qualify to be placed in the capital construction budget, and what is that?

SENATOR WARNER: There is no expenditure authorized in the operations budget in this...for this type of activity, for this kind of renovation. It's all in capital construction.

SENATOR HALL: So, any time a light fixture should, say a light fixture fell from the ceiling...

SENATOR WARNER: That...putting in a light bulb is not renovation.

SENATOR HALL: No, not a light bulb, but a fixture, capital...

SENATOR WARNER: A fixture, no that...

SENATOR HALL: Do we have to have a capital construction budget...

SENATOR WARNER: Sure.

SENATOR HALL: ...appropriation?

SENATOR WARNER: I can read some of the types of things, if that would help you...

SENATOR HALL: I'm just curious as to what...

SENATOR WARNER: Sure.

SENATOR HALL: ...what qualifies under operating with regard to just replacing, like you said, a light bulb doesn't, but I guess
