SENATOR WARNER: Essentially when you're going in and doing a whole room, if you're talking about a fixture...item...and item that has gone bad, that would not be capital construction. I can read the first couple here, install new...this happens to be Burnett Hall, Room 108, total cost, it's a 200 seat room, \$87,000 in total. Install new risers and seats, construct new teaching platform, replace chalk boards, rather, build new control console, build projection booth, install new incandescent lights on dimmers, provide miscellaneous repair and maintenance. It's fairly complete modernization of a large classroom. Another, Avery Hall, install new seats, remove demonstration table, provide miscellaneous repair and maintenance and a portable lab table in the classroom. Those are the kinds of items, old physics building at UN-O, convert chemistry lab to a civil engineering soils lab. They are renovation of a classroom, I guess a more accurate description might be where they go in and do something more than just daily maintenance type things.

SENATOR HALL: Okay, so my point is that there are daily maintenance kinds of repairs that do come out of operating. Is that correct?

SENATOR WARNER: Pardon?

SENATOR HALL: There are some kinds of repairs where you...

SENATOR WARNER: There could be some emergency types of repairs that are operating money.

SENATOR HALL: Okay, thank you very much. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Hartnett, would you like to close on your motion? Oh, okay. The question is the adoption of the Hartnett amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk, please.
