Science Foundation as one of 14 engineering research centers. And the UN-L specialty area would be the optical technology in industrial processes. If UN-L is selected, the college would stand to receive up to \$17 million in research aid and grants, including 14 endowed positions, with the more important item of access to data nationally and internationally, as well as more equipment and infrastructure funds. In the very near future a team will be visiting the site to inspect the quarters and the equipment involved at our own site in Lincoln, and the final decision will be rendered within six to eight months. So this is very appropriate at the time. I need to express my appreciation, again, to Senator Hartnett for the withdrawal. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hartnett, you did wish to withdraw it? Okay, it is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk, anything further?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senators Hartnett and Korshoj would move to amend by striking Section 38.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hartnett, please.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Section 38 is the program, university Program 920, construct Trailside Museum at Ft. Robinson State Park, fiscal year '89-90, would be 98,000 General Fund, '90-91 320,000 General Fund, '91-92 \$2.4 million of General Fund, and '92-93 \$1.2...280,000 General Fund.

PRESIDENT: Senator Korshoj, your light is on.

SENATOR KORSHOJ: Mr. President and members, whose handling this for the Appropriations Committee?

PRESIDENT: I think Senator Scofield, perhaps. Is that right?

SENATOR KORSHOJ: Senator Scofield, when we go down to the third and the fourth year, I don't understand. Is that money, we're promising it, or are we taking it off the table now, or just explain that, please.

SENATOR SCOFIELD: Thank you, Senator Korshoj. I wish I could say we were promising it. That isn't, as you know, the way the system works. There is always opportunity to review this whole thing, and that would have to be handled in a reaffirmation. What I'm asking you to do with this issue, this biennium, is to,
