ought to give me a little credit for that, Senator Scofield, since you've essentially taken over the network for Morrill Hall and redirected it over to the Trailside Museum. So I am pleased to have helped contribute a little to that support base that she's used. In fact, that is the situation that we did develop, as we struggled for years to get money for Morrill Hall, a statewide group of people, ranging from fourth graders in schools across the state to our older citizens who'd followed and cared about Nebraska history for a long time. And Senator Scofield was helpful in that effort and did show them that there was a need, in the Ft. Robinson area, for a similar type of a focus, and it does link to the Morrill Hall activity. The state museum in Lincoln does have an annex, so to speak, operation that will now be a much fuller, better operation under this proposal and out in the Ft. Robinson area. I was disappointed in the committee's movement on this particular measure and not fulfilling the needs of the Morrill Hall site. There is a need for 2 million more dollars, actually 4 million more dollars of funding for Morrill Hall that would complete the project. Four million dollars was appropriated and is now utilized to put in an air control system and to deal with the structural problems of that building. That will be finished at the end of the year. But when we complete that building, there will be many empty rooms and spaces because of the fact that we will have done the things we needed to, and space will be available now that simply will not have any exhibits. We didn't put the money in for the exhibits to follow-up. So phase two of that project is another 4 million dollar obligation, and we hope to raise 2 million privately, and then ask for 2 million more from the Legislature. My only point for Senator Scofield would be, I hope that we will see, in the Appropriations Committee, support eventually to finish that Morrill Hall project, that the 2 million that we need there is essential, that we ought not leave a project half done, we ought to finish that up. And one of the concerns I had was to move onto the next project, before we finish this one, would be a mistake but I do think the Trailside Museum is probably a good idea and it does, as she said, have a tie into what we have already started, and if we can do both, that would be the way I would see us going. So I guess, Senator Scofield, I'm going to help you out here and vote for your Trailside Museum but I hope you and other individuals will eventually help us finish the project at Morrill Hall because, truly, we need both.
