

amendment does not in any way strip the integrity of the planning process from the amendment. It just allows for that money to be appropriated for the first year. It allows for, as Senator Schimek, I think, very eloquently stated, that vision to begin. I think it makes sense to do that. It may...and no part...one of my favorite parts of this state happens to be exactly where the museum would be, a buffalo pasture. But it is clearly an effort to say, look, let's...let's get things lined up, let's make sure that this is the best and most logical and most economical plan for something that I really think is as valuable as has been stated. Senator Wesely raises the issue of Morrill Hall which is extremely interesting because what you have here now is two competing interests. We have spent millions of dollars on that, we're going to be asked for more and much of that space may very well be empty because of the inability to purchase artifacts or displays to showcase in what will be a totally renovated facility once those funds are appropriated as well. This is a situation that says, hey, let's take a look at the planning process. Let's see if the Trailside Museum is the right way to go or should these be displayed in other areas? Should it be there, fine. Then let's come back in, do that appropriation at the time in which we have all the facts in front of us. The amendment does just that. It does nothing more than allow for the planning to continue. I would urge the adoption of the amendment to Senator Hartnett's amendment.
