ideas that maybe this is a place we could get that...the...for instance, away from the \$91 million that I see there and I think that we need to. I think I agree with some people on the...you know, we need to keep an adequate reserve or adequate starting balance for next year, that I think that seems to be the fiscal office has built in and I simply...that is where I come from with that as I sat and listened last week to, you know, things that I thought were good, that were put into...most of the things that were put into LB...or LB 813 last week, I thought they were good, that we did. Some I disagree with and some I voted against, some I voted for. And so I guess, with that, I guess that I am going to ask that I withdraw all the rest of the amendments that I have or...to this particular...to this particular measure, LB 814. I guess that I had some people that were going to speak. I guess I was going to go on the second page, like Senator Schellpeper and Senator Lamb and different ones that would kind of explain why this was needed and I was going to withdraw that. But I think that, you know, we have been ... or I have been in this process for a couple of days and I think that maybe for that reason I would like to withdraw all the rest of the items that I have identified on my amendment, that would be 40...Section 40, 35, 47, 48, 49, 50 and Yes, I think I said 35, yeah. Yeah. So with that, I simply...you know, I think that people had to go and listen to...but for my perspective, I guess, it was a good... I thought it was a good exercise. Maybe other people think differently of me but, from my perspective, I learned a lot more about capital construction in the State of Nebraska.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you, sir. They are withdrawn. Anything further, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have to 814 is by Senators Chizek, Chambers and Kristensen. (See pages 2242-43 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Chizek.

SENATOR CHIZEK: Mr. Speaker, I'm going to make a few...and colleagues, I'm going to make a few comments, then I'm going to pull the amendment and reoffer it on Select File. As many of you know, the Judiciary Committee had a hearing a week and a half or so ago on this whole issue. As I have told Senator Hannibal and some of the members of the Appropriations Committee that this is a difficult job in this area of corrections.
