it seems like many people are indifferent to bracketing this I guess I'm going to rise to really say I think I really oppose the bracket motion. If you bracket it until Monday, you're dealing with the last week we can do anything. Obviously on Friday's, the late night with Bill Barrett of next week, and I think it would important for us to continue to work on this bill. Let's work it out this afternoon, slug it out, if we have There are five sections of this bill...portions of this bill that I'm going to support. I think it would be wise to move it over, discuss it and move it over. If Senator Lynch (inaudible) more information over the weekend, we always have Select File, next week, to work on it. But, if we postpone it until Monday, then we're dealing with the bill on General File, and only all of us know what can happen after next week, and none of us do know what is going to happen next week. I prefer to move LB 525 over today.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Senator Warner, on the bracket motion.

The only other thing I was going to...I ENATOR WARNER: indicated a willingness to do either. I suspect, as I listen to the discussion, it would be helpful to go ahead. In any event I don't know that I said it, or got to initially, but there was two things I have in mind. One is that this bill was intended not to be read, should it get to Final Reading, until all A bills had cleared. It was meant to be at the very end. secondly, if the bill could be advanced and dealt with on Select File, it could, as far as I'm concerned, it could be...could wait on Select File, or, if it went to be Final Reading, be worked back and forth to take out any provision that had been otherwise...where the money had been otherwise appropriated for some other purpose. Obviously, in many...some of these cases one cannot do two things. So, it would probably facilitate things to see if we could move the bill over, and then provide all the additional information anyone would like on Select File.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Landis, would you care to speak to the motion? Thank you. Senator Lynch, there are no other lights on, if you'd like to close, Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Yes, Mr. Chairman and members, I'm in a mood now to withdraw it, providing things happen. I just had a talk with the Speaker, he explained to me about the time problem. I understand that, but it's not all our fault, those of us who are
