

SENATOR HARTNETT: No, that is...I simply want it for my own information, Senator. Why don't you go ahead, Senator Scofield, yeah.

SENATOR SCOFIELD: This primarily had to do with a concern that was raised in the accreditation review that a lot of the people who would actually be considered museum professionals, who were involved in curatorial work, and particularly the mission of Morrill Hall being paleontological preservation, that there didn't appear to be adequate resources devoted to the support staff, and so the recommendation was that there should be some additional support given to the museum so that you didn't have professionals doing what really could be more appropriately termed clerical and less professional kinds of activities. So that was the concern that was raised.

SENATOR HARTNETT: I see, so it was more the staffing and the allocation of staffing, and what you are saying is that the Board of Regents are going to...or the administration at the university.

SENATOR SCOFIELD: It was indicated at that regents meeting that the administration had assured the regents it would be taken care of.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah, thank you very much, Senator Scofield.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Any other discussion? Anything further, Senator Scofield? Thank you. The question is then the adoption of Section 6 to the committee amendments. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, please.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the Section 6 of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Section 6 is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have an amendment to the bill offered by Senator Warner.
