choosing this form, you recognize that there will be a facility built in one of these three counties, because in the end if all three of them say no, it could be sited without their approval. That affirms the vote that was taken by the state this last year. I would suggest to you that you actually hold out the idea of community consent without holding out the idea of community veto with this amendment and the Dierks amendment. I urge you to use the democratic process for relieving tensions, focusing issues, informing the public of this mechanism for the disposition of this issue. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. You have heard the closing and the question is the adoption of the Landis amendment to the Dierks amendment to LB 761. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Voting on the amendment to the amendment. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, let's have a call of the house and all assemble.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Shall the house go under call? Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 1 may to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The house is under call. Members, please record your presence. Those outside the Chamber, please return and record your presence. A request for a roll call vote in reverse order. The house is under call. Senator Withem, please. Senator Ashford, Senator Labedz. Senators Abboud, Haberman, and Warner, the house is under call. Senators Haberman and Warner, the house is under call. Senator Landis.

STATOR LANDIS: (Mike off) ...excused? Yes.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Yes. Senator Landis, Senator Haberman is on his way, may we proceed? A roll call has been requested in reverse order on the amendment to the amendment. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken in reverse order. See page 2356-57 of the Legislative Journal.) 19 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Motion fails. Back to discussion on the Dierks amendment. Senator Elmer, would you care to discuss the amendment? The call is raised.
