And the studies that are being done are showing that the exposure rates that we now have present are possibly as high as 15 times too high for worker exposure, and thus human exposure. The estimates run from 5 to 15 percent that they are too high, and the committee that...international committee that studies this says, yes, there is a very good chance that this possibility is there, but we don't want to raise the limits yet because it might cost too much money. I have a problem with that kind of thinking, and I really would prefer to adopt my amendment and go back farther to establish trends that were there, specifically in my district, before the power plant was there. SENATOR SMITH: It would take more money than we have in the state to do something like that, I would assume. There would be a lot of people that would love to get in on that study.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: I'm sure there are, and that's the same...I have a problem with that, you know, we're...is it costs too much money. If you want to just go ahead and move ahead on this issue, don't adopt my amendment. I really feel it's a good amendment, and I don't want to even get into the question of crafting legislation on the floor on in the committee. But I
