

we are doing is saying you strike the word "existing" and say "grade", and the grade is going to be above grade, as Senator Lamb has indicated. It's going to be safe. It's going to be reasonable but it's not going to prevent the developer from striking a gopher mound or an undulating little bit of a peak out there that might only be a few yards but which if transmitted over the entire site and you were required to make...provide fill to that extent could result in extremely additional...extremely high additional cost. So, therefore, the Lamb amendment makes sense. Now, I understand once in a while in this place what makes sense doesn't prevail. While I'm on it, I just want to tell you why the previous amendment didn't make any sense, ladies and gentlemen. The previous amendment said you would have to unappoint someone. Twenty some people voted to unappoint someone and you can't unappoint anyone. And most of you guys who voted to unappoint someone are lawyers, at least the majority of lawyers in here voted to unappoint someone. That's like this Legislature saying we're going to have two-year legislative terms. Aha, that means all of us with less than four...with more than two years are going to be gone? Oh, no, can't do it. You can't unappoint someone and I wish that my good...that motley looking bunch of Pages over there would listen because they don't look...they're not nearly as attractive as the ones that usually sit there. Once you have got someone on that committee, the Low Level Monitoring Committee, they have got to stay there for the purpose of the...for the term of that period of time. Now if somebody dies, moves off, then you can go ahead and do what Senator Dierks wanted to do. But you couldn't do what Senator Dierks was trying to do. Now, in this case here what Senator Lamb has offered you is a sensible amendment. I would suggest that you take it because if you don't, there may not be a problem but why look for trouble when you don't need it? It's not going to render the site any less safe, any less desirable. It just might save a few bucks and there ought to be some time in this instance when we try to save some money. Thank you.
